Forecasting With Excel

Problem: The Annual Fund wants to be able to see what funding levels they could expect in the next five years, given ten years of Annual Fund Giving Data.

Solution: The linear regression in Microsoft Excel. The Y Intercept and the Slope are necessary to calculate a forecast variable.

Step 1: Enter your data into Excel:

Step 2: Select the column B Cell2 through Cell11, and also C Cell2 through Cell 11 (highlighted data).

Step 3: Go to the **Insert Tab** and click on the small pointer below the **Bar Chart** icon. Select the Scatter Chart. With your data selected Excel will create your chart for you.

Step 4: Right click on one of the plotted points on the chart and select "add Trendline".

Step 5: A dialogue box will appear.

- a. Click the "linear" option
- b. Trendline name defaults to automatic
- c. Check "display equation on chart" box

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It is always a treat to see Josh present and share his wealth of knowledge on analytics and many other fundraising topics. I hope you can make it to this year's event.

New APRA-IN Web Site COMING SOON


A new APRA-IN web site is in the works thanks to **Jackie Knotts**, APRA-IN board member and Webmaster.

Step 6: You may have to left click and move the equation, but your slope-intercept equation which is calculated from the regression will appear.



Step 7: To calculate the Forecast you create a formula in another column.

In Column E, using the Y =mx+B or Y=1120x+20029, we will create the following formula in C11 or D11 after the original data. =**\$E\$1*B1+\$E\$2**

Definition: \$E\$ = absolute value of Cell E1. This number (the slope) will stay constant. \$E\$2 = absolute value of Cell E2. This number (the intercept) will stay constant. B1 will change as you drag the formula down the D column. B1 represents the period of time, in this case in years.

Step 8: Copy the formula down by left clicking on the cell and then placing your cursor over the lower right hand corner on the tiny black square until it turns into a black cross +; then left click and drag down the number of time periods you need.

Now you have your forecasted donations for the time periods you specified!
