Committees

Awards

The awards committee works to recognize members for their dedication to the prospect research industry. There are two specific awards the committee publicizes, reviews applications for and awards on an annual basis. These are the Kathy K. Wilson Scholarship and APRA-IN Service Award. The Kathy K. Wilson Scholarship allows a member to attend an APRA-IN event free of charge. The Service Award recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions to the field and the APRA organization. Additional awards may be developed and awarded if agreed upon by the committee and the Board.

Programming
